This elegant mini album features a great fun fold design with fold-out panels, and a coordinating belly band. It's perfect for gift-giving, special occasions, or preserving favorite memories. Best of all, you can recreate it with any Designer Series Paper in your collection.

QUICK CUTTING REFERENCE

Card Base #1.....	12" x 5¼"	Score: 2", 4"
Left Panel.....	3⅞" x 5¾"	Score: ½"
Right Panel.....	3⅞" x 5⅝"	Score: ½" (Note the smaller size!)
DSP Panels (4).....	1⅞" x 5⅝"	
Left Front White...	3¾" x 5⅝"	
DSP.....	3½" x 4⅞"	
Left Back White.....	3¾" x 5⅝"	
Center White.....	3¾" x 5"	
Right Front DSP.....	3¾" x 5"	
Right Back White...	3¾" x 5"	
Belly Band.....	10" x 1½"	

Assemble the Album

1. Fold and burnish all score lines.
2. Attach the left and right panels to the center base.
3. Adhere all cardstock mats.
4. Add the Designer Series Paper panels.
5. Wrap the belly band around the album and secure with Tear & Tape.
6. Decorate the belly band with the stamped sentiment, layered die cuts, fussy-cut flowers, and Moody Palette Glossy Dots.

Finished Album

This mini album comfortably holds **3–5 photos**, but you can also use the inside panels for journaling, handwritten notes, or stamped sentiments.

Because the design is so versatile, it works beautifully with almost any Designer Series Paper collection.

Debbie's Tips

Don't give up after your first "failed" attempt! Sometimes a project teaches you exactly what it wants to be. This album only came together after I stopped trying to force the original measurements and created my own. Those "do-over" moments often become our favorite projects.

When you're making a mini album that will hold photos, wrap the belly band loosely around the finished album before sealing it. Leaving just a little extra room means your album will still close easily once the pictures are added.
